In the 16th century, the English philosopher Francis Bacon (1561–1626) had this to say about "knowledge": "Knowledge is power! Knowledge is a kind of pleasure, and curiosity is the seed of knowledge." Similar sayings are familiar to people living in the city of Hong Kong, as they have heard the weighty words "knowledge changes destiny" during TV commercials. For the previous generation who experienced losing educational opportunities due to war and poverty, they are particularly concerned about their children's education and growth, hoping their children can seize the opportunities to study well. The saying "if the young do not strive, the old will lament in vain" is the guidance the older generation gave to the younger generation, wishing the youth could strive and thrive in their prime so they would not regret when they grow old. But nowadays, such words are rarely heard from parents' mouths. It's not that they don't value their children's education, but the children no longer need to understand what "strive and thrive" means, as they are constantly "striving and thriving" under their parents' daily "care." The question is, do the parents know what their children are "striving" for and "thriving" on?

If "striving and thriving" is externally imposed, with the children following the parents' pace, the knowledge they absorb may be useful, but how much of it is gained from their own initiative? The emphasis on "initiative" is about finding satisfaction from one's own interests, which is what Bacon referred to as "knowledge is a kind of pleasure, and curiosity is the seed of knowledge." The vitality of all plants starts from the sprout, indicating that the soil's growth conditions and nutrients, as well as nature's air, temperature, moisture, and even the gentle breeze, all affect whether the seed can sprout and grow healthily. Some conditions come from nature, and what people need to contribute is time and dedication, willing to work together with nature.

Applying this to our children, the kindergarten is a place for their growth, where the parents' and teachers' efforts provide a good soil for their sprouting and healthy growth, with quality nutrients allowing them to absorb knowledge and learn to get along with others. But we must not overlook the more important aspect – in the campus life, especially in the process of learning together, are we able to cultivate their "curiosity"? For children, every day is new, as they don't have repetitive homework drills – the graduation rehearsal being an exception. Their height and appearance gradually change as they grow, from unfamiliar to familiar, from resistant to accepting, from knowing nothing to claiming to know everything. "Curiosity" plays a big role in this, giving them the desire to pursue and know more about the things around them. Initiative comes from curiosity, so let's not unconsciously deprive them of the gift from heaven, the curiosity God has specially bestowed upon them. Without curiosity, there is no initiative, and as they grow older, they will only become followers of others, losing the ability to self-reflect, be self-aware, and pursue new things and new knowledge – how regrettable that would be.

For St. Peter's Kindergarten, it has entered its 30th year, still young but with mature experience, and it still holds a curious heart towards new things. We believe that with the parents' care for the school, the teachers' love and gentle guidance, and God's grace, the campus will become a joyful land where children's knowledge can sprout.



It has been 17 years since I joined the St. Peter's Kindergarten. I have experienced every stage of the school, especially during the graduation ceremony, when the teachers were busy rehearsing performances with the students, and making costumes and props.

Birthday parties and festivals are also arranged with fun activities, allowing the children to enjoy and build beautiful memories as they grow. Although it is busy every day, I never feel tired, but rather cherish the days spent with the students.

In the journey of early childhood education, in addition to enjoying the process of teaching young children, I also like to exchange parenting tips with parents. I am fortunate to have established friendly relationships with parents, and even after the children have graduated, they still care for and support the school, which I am very grateful for.

The school team is very important. To improve the teaching quality, we need to have a unified goal and work together to put the school's motto into practice: "Train up a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not depart from it. 


TSE WAI CHAK K2(WD)

As a parent, it is difficult to avoid this rule of the game, but I will often remind myself that every child is special! As long as there is love, I don't compare my child with others, I will be able to find his talent and let him shine in his special field.

I'm lucky, as I enjoy my work and I'm living a decent life. (My diploma has never been used.) I hope that both of my sons can find their paths. This is the luckiest thing in the world!
